Report

Opening Comments – As I write this report our Presbytery, the Queensland Disaster Recovery Chaplains Network has been deployed to respond to the ongoing fire emergencies in Tara, Chinchilla, and Dalby. Today we also have seen several communities devastated by fast moving fires and many communities on watch and wait alert. Join with me in praying for safety and a calm measured response as we face this fire season.

At the end of this month, I would have been in this role for 4 years, I had committed for a 5-year term and have discerned, with the moderator, the chair of both the Presbytery and PRC, that there is more that I think I could offer this Presbytery as Presbytery Minister. I am optimistic about the future, even still with a sense of uncertainty around, but truly believe God is with us and is faithful even when we waver. It has been a life transforming experience to be your presbytery minister and I continue to be blessed by the people in the communities that make up this Presbytery.

I am also blessed to be a part of the team of Presbytery Ministers who work well together to equip and support the mission of God across Queensland. It has been a great privilege, as both complete their terms, to have worked with the General Secretary Rev Heather den Houting and Moderator Rev Andrew Gunton and I pray for them as they venture into new ministry opportunities. The Presbytery Ministers are looking forward to sharing ministry with Rev Bruce Moore (Moderator) and Rev Dr Adam McIntosh (General Secretary) for this next season.

Office Administration – the Presbytery and I has been blessed to have Rev Rob Callow in supply as Resource Minister. Rob has agreed to be in this role until the end of December. We are also blessed to have this new office space here at St Stephen – the Presbytery, in lieu of rent for 3 years invested in the redevelopment of this space to make it more accessible and useable. Administrative support into the future is still up in the air – we are engaging in the Synod Resourcing Review which is looking across Presbyteries at how we can share more effectively some resources such as administration. I am working with Kellie Broderick (Ministry Matters Unit) to see what is required to support the

administrative work of our Presbytery. We hope in the by the next Presbytery we will have some options.

Saltbush – the team at Saltbush continue to offer their gifts and skills and I would encourage people to take advantage of the Online Café sessions and the weekly Around the Bush – sharing life together.

Presbytery Synod Interface (PSI) – there has been a few changes in the team of PSI, David Busch (SMP) and Mark Cornford (MRP) has left their roles and we pray for those Presbyteries as they consider those roles. The main area of focus for PSI is resourcing the mission of the church effectively and well;

Pastoral Care Oversight Committee – there is much to celebrate as we to support the CPE training of Hospital Volunteers. The recent decision of the Standing Committee of Qld Synod to cease funding Hospital Chaplaincy from June 2024 has but a spanner in the works and is on the agenda for our next meeting. It is an incredible ecumenical team who provide pastoral care to people in vulnerable spaces.

Toowoomba Interfaith Working Group – it was a blessing to join with other faiths to prayer for the people of Israel and the Middle East, it was a space with many tears and prayer together. We also celebrated together as we walked the Carnival of Flowers parade as a common goal for harmony.
