Maybe there's something in the water or perhaps it's just that time of year, but our Presbytery will see a few personnel changes next year.

- Rev Adam Tipple will conclude his term as Presbytery Chairperson in February.
- Rev Ansie Liebenberg has indidcated that she is stepping down as chairperson for the Pastoral Relations Committee.
- Rev Rob Callow finishes as the (Supply) Presbytery Resource Minister at the end of this year.
- Mrs Margaret Spinks wraps up many years as Middle Ridge UC Administrator.

In addition to this, the "almost reverend" Annie Baker, member of Middle Ridge UC, has accepted a call to ministry at St Paul's Uniting Church Stafford (Brisbane). Annie has completed her student requirements, and having received the Presbytery's approval last month, will be ordained as a Minister of Deacon at Middle Ridge UC on Saturday 16 December at 3.00pm.

Annie has been the Toowoomba facilitator for the Clinical Pastoral Education course for many years and reports that she will continue this role next year alongside her ministry at St Paul's. In light of recent changes to hospital chaplaincy, Annie feels it's essential to keep the CPE course going.

Annie's departure from our region also signals the departure of partner Sharon. Sharon Baker, also a member of Middle Ridge congregation, has been working in pastoral support with Blue Care for many years and has also served on the Presbytery Standing Committee.

We are grateful to all who have served in different roles and we are always saddened when our people leave. However we celebrate the potential of new ministry opportunity that these departures present.

The Council of Presbytery will seek to elect/appoint people into the regional vacancies at the February gathering next year and asks all within the Downs to consider serving through these roles:

- The presbytery office by providing administrative assistance to the presbytery executive and congregations.
- OPresbytery Standing Committee and keeping the operations of our district running well.
- Pastoral Relations Committee which oversees the pastoral and relational aspects of the presbytery including ministry agents and congregations.

We are excited to welcome to our Ministry team in The Downs Rev Tanya Richards as the Connect 100 Community Chaplain, Lifeworks Uniting Church. Here's a little bit about Tanya:

'I was born in Bundaberg and grew up in Redcliffe, as a young adult during my training I moved around northern suburbs of Brisbane. I have family in Hervey Bay and Caboolture. Along with many more around QLD, my mum is one of 14 children. In 2022 I had to say goodbye to my Labrador (Ebony) who was just on 12 years old. She was a big part of my life and I still miss her. Although I'm enjoying the freedom of travel and seeing new parts of Qld.

I was ordained as a Deacon of the Uniting Church in 2008, during my training I had an opportunity to do a field placement in Bali Indonesia, where I worked with and supported the mission of the local English

speaking congregation who is one of our partner churches through Uniting World. During this time I volunteered with Young Adults and as a Chaplain in the prison. This was the start of 10 years of visiting Bali and volunteering with the local church.

My first placement after my training was with Qld Churches Together in the ACT for Peace program (Christmas Bowl) as I traveled around QLD I was privileged to meet many communities, faith communities and Uniting Churches. I was also able to see a bit more of the world as I lead trips to Sri Lanka and Timor Leste.

After 3 years of this, I moved into Public Hospital Chaplaincy working at both The Prince Charles Hospital and just recently at the Sunshine Coast Hospital and Health Service. In these spaces I worked with Senior Leadership to see change and recognition of Chaplaincy in the Public Hospital space, creating state wide Framework of how Chaplains work, I also worked on many new programs and expressions of Chaplaincy.

I'm excited to be joining the Lifeworks congregation and the wider Toowoomba area in this new role of Community Minister, I'm looking forward to meeting you all. I have recently brought some new coats and blankets, as I hear it gets cold in Toowoomba'

We pray for Tanya as she finishes up her current role and moves to Toowoomba to begin this new role in January 2024.
