Warwick's Jumpers and Jazz in July festival always presents a theme for the trees that are yarn bombed and they are quite spectacular. The theme this year was cascade – and I didn't want to just go with a waterfall – which I thought would be popular in the displays. So I googled and came up with the idea that things cascade from where they are to where they aren't. Then I got to thinking that for most of us our faith has been passed on to us from our ancestors – parents and grandparents etc.

As I sat for hours crocheting and thinking I thought this would be a wonderful opportunity for our members to acknowledge the great blessing we have been gifted. So I asked all our members to give me the names of three generations in their family through which they have inherited their faith. These were printed on grape leaves and strung together to witness to our faith story. The base of the tree was decorated with a large grape vine – as we are people of the vine.

I have included an image of our decorated tree – complete with our helper, Junior – who was young enough to stand on a box to fix the higher leaves. The cascade of leaves represented our faith which has cascaded down the generations. As they flap in the wind they activate a movement sensor device that is programmed to speak the bible verses that are fixed on the tree – all relating to how our faith and blessings flow from one generation to the next.
